

# BIG HISTORY WEBSITE SCAVENGER HUNT

## Purpose

This scavenger hunt is an orientation activity that will help you become familiar with the Big History website. There is a lot of stuff on this website, and many materials you'll need to access throughout the course. Figuring out where everything is early will save you a lot of trouble as you get into later units.

## Process

Working on your own, you'll search for information all over the Big History site. Some of the things you'll look for are embedded in materials, and some will be more obvious. Once you have completed your scavenger hunt, check your answers against your classmates' to ensure you've found all the correct information. If you haven't, ask your teacher about where to go on the site, and then find it yourself. Doing the search yourself, as opposed to watching someone else do it, will help you remember that information.
